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#### WALKS

There are both short walks of 2 to 3 miles and longer walks of around 5 miles, but occasionally longer. Typically our walks attract between about 12 and 25 members. Longer walks held since the last edition of Renaissance have been at Chedgrave and Loddon, Thurne and Oby, at Horstead and Coltishall, around Minsmere and Dunwich and at Honingham. Shorter walks have also been held around Earlham Cemetery and at Mulbarton.

All walks start at **10.30am** (unless otherwise stated) but please arrive at the meeting place by at least 10.15am, especially if a pub lunch is planned in case we have to pre-order food. Car sharing would be appreciated. Walking boots or sturdy shoes are recommended.

Places on the walks must be booked by contacting the walk leader via email or telephone, by the deadline date shown. Please ensure emails contain your name, contact telephone number, number of places and, where appropriate, the number of lunches required. This is particularly important for walks with pub lunches so that the managers may reserve appropriate space for us. Please note that there may be limited numbers for some pub lunches, and these will be allocated on a strictly 'first come first served' basis (so it pays to contact the walk leader as early as possible!).

These walks, and all other sporting and leisure activities, have inherent hazards associated with them. In spite of the safety of members of each walk being of paramount concern to its leader/leaders, accidents will occasionally occur. It is important therefore that, before taking part in any of our walks, every member appreciates that they each have an individual responsibility to be aware of possible hazards, and will each be expected to take all reasonable steps to minimise any potential for an accident to occur.

i.e. each walker takes part at his/her own risk.

The walk will be approximately 8.5 miles. Beeston Common can be muddy at any time of year so gaiters and boots are recommended. The climbs up and down Stone and Ingleborough Hills are short and sharp.

Meet at the car park at The Plains off A1082 (the main road into Sheringham). The car park is opposite the 30mph sign on the right-hand side of the road in the woods if you are driving towards north, towards the sea.

We will walk eastwards through the woods skirting south of Sheringham, Beeston Regis and West Runton with ascents of Stone Hill and Ingleborough Hill for superb views east and west along the coast. Either of these hills is lovely for a coffee stop. We will then drop down to East Runton. If the tide is low we will walk along the sandy beach to West Runton where there is a cafe, toilets and places to sit for lunch. If the tide is high we will proceed along the cliff top path. After lunch our path will follow the coastal footpath to the base of Beeston Bump where we will cut back in land via Beeston Priory to Beeston Common and then back through the woods to the car park. This is a walk of just over 5 miles with no stiles starting at Rockland Staithe car park. The walk follows the Wherryman's Way, alongside Rockland Broad and river Yare until the Beauchamp Arms. There are also large areas of wildflowers and a collection of sculptures, including a large study of Peter Pan which is particularly stunning. 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
